[2] K-laser After surgery or dentistry, we recommend K-laser therapy which speeds healing.

[3] IV fluids IV fluid provides increased warmth and blood pressure support, especially beneficial for heart and kidneys as well as anaesthetic recovery. We recommend it for most anaesthetics (except for short sedations and cat castrations).

Note on K-laser use with tumours There is a small amount of conflicting evidence about the effect of laser therapy on neoplastic (cancer cell) activity. There is some evidence of increased activity and also evidence demonstrating inhibition of cancer cell activity – an anti-cancer effect. Our approach is that when applying K-laser in wounds where neoplastic

cells have been removed, any risk is outweighed by the benefits of laser therapy. Our policy is that an owner attending K-laser session should wear protective glasses and that refusal to do so is at your own risk. By requesting K-laser through this form, you are giving informed consent in line with the above-described
